February 2012 DIVINE ENCOUNTERS, visitors and visiting teams, weddings, the Jesus Film Project and lots of other stuff.....makes for a good month. Here are some highlights.....:

- A man from England bought my book from me while on a tour bus. He wrote one week later saying he returned home and his wife has been diagnosed with cancer. "Please pray for us."
- Paul, a Roman Catholic deacon, returned to Panama to see the Navy base where he was stationed in 1945. We talked, he bought my book at the hotel and used my testimony for his homily when he returned for the following Sunday to his parish in Connecticut. Now we are friends and now he gets my monthly newsletter.
- I have been contacted by former "Zonians" and new people for a total of four weddings during the coming months. All are reading books, doing workbooks and watching FIREPROOF and COURAGOUS dvds for their counseling. This is a great opportunity to challenge couples to live for Jesus in their generation.
- Chris and Elise Regan, from the International House of Prayer spoke at our morning service recently. The service lasted two hours (most services do) and people stayed for another hour and a half for personal prayer.
- A team from the JESUS FILM PROJECT will be staying in our church this month and recording the Jesus Film in the Embera language. This is the language the Indians spoke in the movie, END OF THE SPEAR, which was made here in Panama. It is estimated to take at least two weeks and will be a wonderful evangelistic tool to reach those in the remote jungle areas that do not speak Spanish and many cannot read or write. They will also be speaking and giving video presentations at our morning service. To learn more about the JFP, go to google for a search. The film has now been put into more than 1200 languages.
- We had two teams from Wisconsin and a team from the Ben Lippen high school in S.C. minister at morning services, the prison and the Wounaan Indian village
- At the time of this writing, former General Noriega has had a stroke and has been taken from the Renacer prison in Gamboa to a hospital in Panama City. He is expected to return in a few

days. He is now seventy-seven years old. I am still praying for that divine appointment with him.
